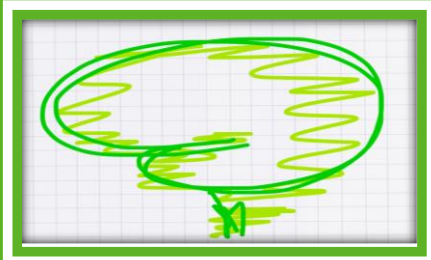


Living Now with Low-Grade Glioma study seeking participants
